Introduction

We will explore some new destinations as well as some old favorites. Your student has seen the pictures in the science textbooks, now they can experience the science *in action, first hand*. Whether it's experiencing flying high at I-Fly or exploring the Hill Country by Zip-Line, your child is sure to learn and see many fascinating things—not to mention having a great time. *Who knows, we might blow up something!*

We believe *the middle school/junior high years* are a time for exploring and investigation...and having a lot of fun learning along the way. Young people are developing their dreams for the future at this age. At *Summer Science Safari*, we help students envision their futures and what it will take to achieve their goals. We pack as much science and learning into five days as we can, then top it off with lots of fun.

Kenneth Fletcher will again be leading this year's camp. Ken has been a teacher in public education for the past 21 years. He holds a Master of Science Degree from the University of Houston-Victoria. He spent the first ten years of his career at Briscoe Jr High School in North Fort Bend County, and since moved out to Rosenberg to start and raise his family. He has been teaching in the Lamar Consolidated ISD for the past 21 years. He currently teaches 7th and 8th grade science at **Antionette Reading Junior High School and Coaches the very well-respected Reading JHS Science Olympiad Team.** This will be his second summer of facilitating the **Summer Science Safari in the Fort Bend Area**.

Even though the Camp operates from *Reading Junior High School in Richmond and University Center in Sugarland*, all *current (SY 2020/2021)* 5th through 8th grade students in the Sugarland/Richmond/Rosenberg/Fort Bend County Areas are welcome in ANY SESSION and arrangements can be may to pick up students at either location.

Itinerary

Due to the "Field Trip" nature of the Camp, minor schedule and activity changes are likely. Check Website, regularly, for updates.

Day 1

Rock Climbing, Dinosaurs, and Scuba.... We will start the day with an old favorite—a Rock Climbing Lesson. We're really excited to offer a great way for the kids to "hang" with their friends Next, we will be visiting a local **Escape Room** to test the students' deductive ability to get out of things---like school and homework. Lastly, it is back to the area for a beginners **Scuba Diving lesson**. No prior experience needed for this day's dive.



Certified diving instructors will introduce the kids to the world of scuba diving. Instructors will work with the kids and teach them all the do's and don'ts of scuba diving. Each child will be equipped with the latest dive gear and instruction, then they will spend time diving with a scuba tank in the dive school pool.

Day 2

This day we will head to Texas A&M University for a day of real science. We will begin our day with a tour of the Texas

A&M University Medical School—one of the newest and most modern in the country. Then we are off to learn about *Nuclear Power* and get an up-close look at a *working nuclear reactor*. From there we will stop at TEEX Fire Fighting School and Disaster City, Disaster city is a mockup of a destroyed town. Crushed buildings, massive car pile ups, train wrecks and crashed airplanes are all used here to teach lifesaving skills. Then, it is on to a Cold-Physics Presentation by professors in the Physics Department in the Stephen Hawking Auditorium. Have you ever stuck your hand in Liquid Nitrogen? It will give you chills! Our last stop is the



Chemistry Department where the students will be given a great Chemistry Show.... Sparks will fly! Look out for More adventures to be added--like blowing up something!

Day 3

Today, we're off to Schlitterbahn in New Braunfels for a day of breathtaking rides, cool streams, and entertainment.



For dinner, we will be stopping at Willie's Grill and Icehouse in San Antonio. Later, we will be staying at the Exotic Resort Zoo in Johnson City where llamas, camels, and all kinds of exotic animals come right to the fence at our log cabins...of course, there will be separate girls' and boys' cabins. We'll have a huge bonfire that night and a great pool.



Day 4

On this day we start the day at Natural Bridge Caverns where the students will explore one of the



finest show caverns in Texas. Next and new this year, we'll visit underwater meadow of San Marcus Springs and tour in Glass Bottom **Boats** where the students will see how the **Edwards Aquifer** feeds the Next, it's on to the Wimberley Zip-Line. professionals will take us on a Zip-line tour over the Texas Hill Country. Emphasis will be placed on ecology, safety, and fun

On our last day we'll be floating and flying...First, we start our final day with a tour of the *Galveston* Bay by tour boat wherel, in addition to great views, the students will get to study the ecology of the Bay. Next, we finish our week with a sky diving adventure at I-Fly where the students will discover the thrill of this fun sport. What a week?
